Review of Pupil Premium and Recovery Premium Expenditure 2020-2021 Report on use of Pupil Premium funding for 2020-2021

1. During the 2020-2021 academic year the school received £189,090 in Pupil Premium funding.
2. During the 2020-2021 academic year the following number of pupils were eligible to receive pupil premium funding:
 - a. for 1 looked after child
 - b. for 138 pupils eligible to receive free school meals in years 7-11 at a year PP funding of £1000 per student
 - c. for 48 pupils in years 7-11 who had been eligible to receive free school meals at some time during the past six years, with a year PP funding of £650 per student.
3. The cost of providing a free school meal (£2.41 per day)
4. **Expenditure of Pupil Premium funding during the 2020-2021 academic year (based on £955 per student)**
