

# Year 7 German Induction Challenge:

You know more German than you realise!



German and English are very closely related languages – known as sister languages – because they originated from the same parent language (Germanic).

Because of this there are lots of similarities in vocabulary, which helps a lot when learning a new language.

Words which are identical in spelling and meaning between two languages are called cognates. Words which are very similar are called near-cognates.

**TASK 1: read the text about Karl very carefully!**

**Eine Katze und eine Maus im Haus? Ja, das ist o.k. Gretel ist dumm und Mausi ist intelligent.**
